SUSPENSION GUIDELINES FOR STORM SIGNALS DURING REMOTE LEARNING

SIGNAL #1



Online synchronous classes are suspended due to internet connectivity issues caused by the typhoon.

SIGNAL #2



Online synchronous classes are suspended due to internet connectivity issues, as well as possible power and telecommunication service interruption caused by the typhoon. The faculty is requested to extend leniency and flexibility (especially to students from affected areas) by postponing submission deadlines.

SIGNAL #3 & ABOVE



Both synchronous and asynchronous classes are suspended due to internet connectivity issues, as well as possible power and telecommunication service interruption caused by the typhoon. The faculty is requested to refrain from asking students to submit any class requirements.



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DIFFERENT TYPHOON SIGNAL IN A STUDENT'S PLACE OF RESIDENCE



Suspension will be on a case-to-case basis. It is possible for one class to have students who are not affected by the typhoon, while some may be affected by different storm signals (1, 2, or 3 and above). The guidelines shall be applied depending on the students' place of residence, or where they have chosen to participate in synchronous or asynchronous classes.

The university follows a case-to-case basis application of the guidelines without prejudice to students who might miss synchronous class sessions as a result of the suspension.

POST-TYPHOON DEVASTATION



Students need to inform (during and/or after the typhoon) their professors of their situation (power outage, internet connectivity issues, among others) so the latter can adjust for them the lessons, activities, assignments, deadlines and requirements to ensure no students are left behind.

Faculty members may also proactively ask and identify who among their students are affected by the typhoon.

AFFECTED FACULTY MEMBERS



The same guidelines apply to the faculty. In addition, the faculty needs to inform the students of his/her situation so they are cognizant of possible adjustments that have to be made in all his/her classes.
